

SYNOD 2020: OUR JOURNEY SO FAR



Thank you to those who came along to the previous parish meetings which discussed the first two Synod Themes and formulated the proposals from Holy Family parishioners as to what we would like to see included on the Synod Agenda. The proposals from Holy Family Parish which have been submitted to the Synod Office are:

THEME 1: ALL CALLED AND GIFTED BY GOD

Proposal 1 With the declining number of priests and the increased busyness of our lives we would like to have General Absolution more often, not only to bring us all closer to God as a community through the liturgical celebration, but as a means of 'grave necessity'

Proposal 2 To bring about a diocesan office for the promotion of 'collaborative' ministry which is open to supporting such a ministry at parish level. The office for collaborative ministry will be inclusive in its ethos and outreach and seek to promote collaborative ministry and leadership of all the baptised called and gifted for parish ministry (ordained missionary disciples and non-ordained missionary disciples).

Proposal 3 The Pastoral Formation Department to develop a branch which will implement training, guidance and support for priests and parishes to have closer links with their attached schools and for these links to incorporate the school more fully into the life of the parish family.

Proposal 4 'Our priests don't meet our youth and our youth don't have much contact with our clergy or parishioners.' To better support ways in which 'Just Youth' can reach out to the youth in our parish. To explore ways of employing youth workers to be present in each Church and to work collaboratively together with other youth workers in our deanery.

Proposal 5 To further promote ways of developing ongoing faith formation for parishioners. For the Irenaeus Project to have the funding and resources to train and support 'outreach educators' for the purpose of sustaining and furthering faith formation for all people in our parishes.

THEME 2: SHARING THE MISSION OF JESUS

Proposal 1 To develop and implement an outreach programme consisting of volunteers (diocesan or parish level) aimed at recognising and supporting the needs of young families in our parish communities. To listen to and support in various ways those parents who feel overburdened by the pressures of life and find it difficult to cope.

Proposal 2 To better utilise our sacred spaces and re-open our churches again for the purpose of creating spaces/places of safe haven and quietness amid the noise and pressures of everyday commitments. To have our churches open again even for a few hours once a week and for this opening to be sufficiently supervised through careful planning and organisation at parish level. Offer a variety of programmes each week for all people of our community (prayer, tea/coffee, mediation, sacred music).

Proposal 3 To be committed to prioritising the needs of the most needy especially the elderly in their own homes who can longer make it to Sunday or weekday Mass. To reach out and visit the elderly in their own homes and include them in our parish family through offering our friendship and support.

Proposal 4 To support a commitment by the Archdiocese to ongoing faith formation and training for our priests, deacons and lay ministers to better equip us for evangelization, pastoral care, ecumenical work, interfaith work and collaborative ministry with the aim to be a dynamic Church sharing in the mission of Jesus.

Proposal 5 To recognise and accept that all people are called and gifted by God and in doing so offering a Mass (weekly/monthly) for all those who feel that they are marginalised and not accepted by the Church including members of the LGBTQ+community. Everybody is welcome, no terms and conditions apply!

THE NEXT MEETING TO DISCUSS AND FORMULATE PROPOSALS FROM HOLY FAMILY PARISH ON THEME THREE ("HOW WE PRAY TOGETHER") WILL TAKE PLACE IN THE PARISH HALL AFTER MASS ON SUNDAY THE 26TH OF JANUARY. PLEASE DO COME ALONG TO IT, BECOME INVOLVED IN THE SYNOD PROCESS, AND MAKE YOUR VOICE HEARD.

1893 - Parish Founded. Previously served as a mission by priests from Saint William's Parish, Ince.

1893 to 1895: First Parish Priest: Fr. John Barry. Born Ireland 1864. Died 27th September 1944. He is buried at St. Peter's, Woolston, Warrington.

1895 - First church and school built

1895 to 1905: Parish Priest: Fr. Louis Verbrugghe. Born Belgium 1853. Died 6th February 1919.

1905 to 1908: Parish Priest: Fr. James Wade. Born Liverpool 1869. Died 21st February 1948.

1908 to 1911: Parish Priest: Fr. Edward Murphy. Born Liverpool 1867. Died 31st October 1933. He is buried at Ford Cemetery, Liverpool.

1911 to 1922: Parish Priest: Fr. Matthew McEnroe. Born Ireland 1870. Died 8th January 1960.

1922 to 1928: Parish Priest: Fr. Joseph Rimmer. Born Liverpool 1863. Died 20th March 1928. He is buried at Our Lady's, Bryn.



REMEMBERING DECEASED PARISHIONERS

We now have a Book of Remembrance, placed beside Our Lady's altar. It lies open at today's date, showing the names of those of our parishioners who died on that day and the year of their death.

Unfortunately, the list is not comprehensive. Churches are not obliged to keep a Register of Deaths, and no such register was kept in Holy Family Parish from its foundation in 1893 until Father John Kennedy began to keep a record of deaths in 1961. For some unknown reason, this stopped in 1964 but was resumed by Father Philip Barrett in 1981 and has been maintained ever since.

You may wish to glance at the names of those whose anniversaries occur at this time, perhaps to remember them, but certainly to pray for them, and maybe even to light a candle for them.

HOLY FAMILY PARISH ACCOUNTS FOR YEAR ENDING 31ST DECEMBER 2019

The Financial Statement for the parish for 2019 has now been prepared and submitted to the Archdiocese.

Our total income for the year was £50,560. However our total expenditure was £88,055 which means the parish ran at a deficit of £37,495. Even taking into account the cost of the new heating boiler which was installed last year (£31,500) we would still have ended the year with a loss of approximately £6,000.

Every parish operates with donations to the Offertory Collection at Mass as its main source of regular income which, including the Christmas and Easter Offertories, came to £21,600. That sum was supplemented by other occasional income during 2019 which included donations (£12,050), Gift Aid (£5,900), and fundraising activities (£2,760). Sincere thanks to those who contributed.

Although we expected to end the year still overdrawn, as at the 31st of December 2019 our bank balance actually stood in credit at £4,600. (As at the 31st of January 2020 this had fallen to £2,856).

Following some very strong advice received from the Archbishop, many churches have chosen to suspend certain liturgical practices.

Much of the advice given about the Corona Virus from various "experts" seems to be conflicting and confusing. But here at Holy Family Church, for the moment we are making three changes to our normal practice with immediate effect:

- (1) Due to the high frequency of direct contact with saliva in distributing Holy Communion, THE SACRED HOST WILL BE PLACED ONLY INTO YOUR OPEN HAND AND NOT ON YOUR TONGUE. (This will affect only a very few, but if you choose not to receive the Host into your hand, then you are choosing not to receive Holy Communion).
- (2) Holy Water has been removed from the stoups at the church door. (You may continue to bless yourself as you enter the church but without using Holy Water).
- (3) Father Tony and Deacon Mike will continue to stand at the back of church at the end of Sunday Mass but will not offer or expect you to shake hands.

For everything else, we rely on your own common sense. We will continue for now (until we may be forbidden from doing so) to offer Communion from the Chalice, but no one should feel they have to drink from it. We will also continue to invite you to offer a Sign of Peace to one another, but this may be done with a smile and a nod of the head, rather than with any physical contact.

Anyone with cold or flu symptoms should not come to church and, in such cases, this would not be regarded as deliberately missing Mass (you should spend time in prayer at home instead).

And the most common sense piece of advice given to us all is to wash our hands frequently with soap and water throughout the day. And don't panic!

King Richard II in 1381, will not be the gift of the country of England, but the personal gift of the faith of the people of England to the Mother of God. We call upon Our Lady to guide and protect our country in the years to come, that we may work together to build a common good, as we seek to embrace the truth of the Gospel. The re-dedication seeks to inspire us to create a culture that respects life, embraces the great diversity of our people, and inspires all to a greatness of heart that will serve our community, seeking the good of others before ourselves, especially the poor and the marginalised of our world."

The Act of Re-dedication will take place on Sunday the 29th of March at 12 noon at England's National Shrine of Our Lady at Walsingham, and repeated in Catholic cathedrals and churches across England. In next week's newsletter we'll give you details of how we as individuals can be involved and of how the Act of Rededication will take place here at Holy Family Church.

As a prelude to the Act of Re-dedication, at the end of Mass next Sunday (Mothering Sunday) the Little Church children will present flowers before the statue of Our Lady in the Lady Chapel.

LENTEN ALMS COLLECTION

Almsgiving is a traditional work of charity during Lent, especially the collection of Lenten Alms which are the financial gains we make from our Lent penance of "giving something up". If not given personally by us to a charitable cause, then these are traditionally sent to the bishop who uses them to provide relief and support to the poor and needy.

You can continue to hand in requests for Mass to be offered for your intentions. Post them through the presbytery letterbox or email them to Father Tony. All **OTHER PUBLIC GATHERINGS** in our churches are also suspended, such as Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals. (Funerals will now be celebrated only at the graveside or crematorium, with just the immediate family present, and a Mass "In Memoriam" celebrated at a later date when things return to normal.)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

In response to the Coronavirus pandemic, so many aspects of our lives must change. This includes the ways in which we publicly express our faith. It is very clear that, following official advice and in order to keep each other safe, save lives and support the NHS, at this time we must not gather for public acts of worship in our churches. This will begin from Friday evening, 20th March 2020, until further notice.

Our churches will remain open. They are not closing. They will be a focal point of prayer, where you will find solace and strength. In visiting our churches at this time, we will observe with great care the practices of hygiene and the guidance on social distancing. However, the celebration of Mass, Sunday by Sunday and day by day, will take place without a public congregation.

Knowing that the Mass is being celebrated; joining in spiritually in that celebration; watching the live-streaming of the Mass; following its prayers at home; making an act of spiritual communion: this is how we share in the Sacrifice of Christ in these days. These are the ways in which we will sanctify Sunday, and indeed every day.

We want everyone to understand that in these emergency circumstances, and for as long as they last, the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days is removed. This is, without doubt, the teaching of the Church (Catechism of the Catholic Church 2181). This pandemic is the 'serious reason' why this obligation does not apply at this time.

You will find more details about the pathway of prayer and sacramental life we are now to take on the Bishops' Conference website (www.cbcew.org.uk). Your own bishop and parish priest will provide further support, encouragement and information about our way of prayer together in the coming weeks.

The second vital aspect of these challenging times is our care for each other. There are so many ways in which we are to do this: being attentive to the needs of our neighbour, especially the elderly and vulnerable; contributing to our local food banks; volunteering for charitable initiatives and organisations; simply keeping in touch by all the means open to us.

During these disturbing and threatening times, the rhythm of the prayer of the Church will continue. Please play your part in it. The effort of daily kindness and mutual support for all will continue and increase. Please play your part in this too. For your commitment to this, we thank you.

WE'RE BACK ... but not to the "old normal"

You may wish to come to a weekday Mass instead, or to pray at home and continue to access the virtual celebration of Mass online.

Social distancing must be observed at all times (one metre at least or more) and so every second bench has been closed off. Only sit together if you live in the same household. Please remain seated. Do not use the bench kneelers. Face coverings (a mask or scarf covering your mouth) should be worn while you are inside the church (you may lower it to be able to receive Communion).

To allow social distancing in smaller gatherings, there will be TWO Masses celebrated each Sunday here at Holy Family Church at 11.00am and at 5.00pm. Each Mass will be limited to 90 persons. Mass will be shorter, there will be no singing or processions, the Gloria and Creed will be omitted. Holy Communion will be distributed after Mass, not during it.

Hand sanitizer has been placed in the porch to use before you come into or leave the church. (You may wish to bring your own hand sanitizer with you to use each time before you enter or leave the church.)

Take a copy of the Sunday Mass Sheet and the Weekly Newsletter and any other papers as you enter church and take them home with you afterwards, either to keep or to dispose of. Do not leave them on the bench or at the back of church after Mass.

There will be no hymn singing at Mass and so hymnbooks are not required.

Weekday Missals will not be made available for weekday Mass.

Place your Offertory Collection donation into the baskets provided as you enter or leave church. There will be no Offertory Collection or Procession of Gifts during the Mass. Mass Intention requests and any other donations can also be The church toilet may not be used except in a case of genuine emergency. placed into the baskets.

Holy Communion will be distributed after the Mass is ended; only the priest will receive Communion at the usual place during Mass. Stewards will direct you to come up, observing social distancing. Do not form a queue for Communion. The chalice will not be offered and the Sacred Host will be placed only into your extended open hand, not onto your tongue. The invitation "The Body of Christ" and its response "Amen" will not be spoken. The priest will wear a mask when distributing Holy Communion.

You should leave church immediately after receiving Holy Communion. You should follow the one-way system and continue to observe social distancing, leaving individually, not as a crowd.

Lingering clusters of people in conversation either inside the church or in the porch or outside the church, are to be avoided.

And finally We understand that, after being in isolation for such a long period of time, some will be afraid of suddenly being in a large gathering with others. In which case, instead of coming to Sunday Mass you may wish to come along to a weekday Mass on Tuesday or Thursday at 10.00am when there will be fewer people present. The obligation of Mass on Sunday remains suspended.

REVISED MASS TIMES

Please note our revised Mass Times here at Holy Family Church:
Sundays: Two Masses at 11.00am and 5.00pm
Tuesday and Thursday: Mass at 10.00am each day
No Mass or Confessions now on Saturday mornings
Each Mass will be limited to 90 persons being able to attend.

PRIVATE PRAYER AND LIGHTING CANDLES

The church will be open thirty minutes before the start of every Mass but will close immediately afterwards. You may spend time in private prayer, and/or light any votive candles before Mass during those thirty minutes but not after Mass – you should leave church immediately after receiving Holy Communion. Remember to observe the new One-Way system in church at all times.

PROVIDING FACE COVERINGS

The regulations state that face coverings (a face mask or a scarf covering your mouth) must be worn whenever you come to church. Please note that on your first visit we will provide you with a face mask if you do not have one with you. On every other occasion you will be expected to bring your own.

GOING TO CONFESSION

Confessions will not be heard in the confined space of the confessional. Anyone who <u>needs</u> to celebrate this sacrament should see Father Tony and their confession will be heard while observing social distancing. Remember that the Church has always taught that our everyday faults (venial sins) are forgiven simply by praying a sincere and heartfelt Act of Contrition.







REFLECTION BY POPE FRANCIS ON THE ASSUMPTION (2014)

Today we celebrate the Assumption of Our Lady, body and soul, into the glory of heaven. Mary's Assumption shows us our own destiny as God's adoptive children and members of the body of Christ. Like Mary our Mother, we are called to share fully in the Lord's victory over sin and death, and to reign with him in his eternal Kingdom. This is our vocation.

In venerating Mary, Queen of Heaven, we also turn to her as Mother of the Church. We ask her to help us to be faithful to our Baptism, to guide our efforts to transform the world in accordance with God's plan, and to enable the Church to be ever more fully a leaven of his Kingdom in the midst of society. May Christians be a generous force for spiritual renewal at every level of society. May they combat the allure of a materialism that stifles authentic spiritual and cultural values, and the spirit of unbridled competition which generates selfishness and strife. May they also reject inhumane economic models which create new forms of poverty and marginalize workers, and the culture of death which devalues the image of God, the God of life, and violates the dignity of every man, woman and child.

In celebrating this feast, we look to Mary as our Mother of Hope. Her song of praise reminds us that God never forgets his promise of mercy (cf. Lk 1:54-55). Mary is the one who is blessed because "she believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her by the Lord" (Lk 1:45). In her, all God's promises have been proved trustworthy. Enthroned in glory, she shows us that our hope is real; even now it reaches as "a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul" (Heb 6:19) to where Jesus is seated in glory.

This hope, dear brothers and sisters, the hope held out by the Gospel, is the antidote to the spirit of despair that seems to grow like a cancer in societies which are outwardly affluent, yet which often experience inner sadness and emptiness. Upon how many of our young has this despair taken its toll! May they, the young, never be robbed of their hope!

Let us turn to Our Lady and implore the grace to rejoice in the freedom of the children of God, to use that freedom wisely in the service of our brothers and sisters, and to live and work as signs of the hope which will find its fulfilment in that eternal Kingdom where to reign is to serve.

WHEAT INTOLERANT OR COELIAC?

We have low-gluten altar breads available (gluten content 20 parts per million and approved by the Coeliac Society UK). Please inform the priest or deacon each time you come to Mass if you would like the priest to consecrate one of these altar breads especially for you to be able to receive Communion.

BAPTISMS AND FUNERALS

We can now celebrate the **Celebration of Baptism** in church once again. This must be in a private ceremony with no more than thirty people present. 

SUNDAY COMMENT by Bishop John Rawsthorne

"Of all the pressing challenges facing our country at this time, the politicians are pushing the desperate asylum seekers risking their lives in small boats crossing the Channel to the number one priority, or very close to it.

As a fellow human being, my heart goes out to those poor people. How desperate do you have to be to put yourself in the hands of people whose only interest is in your money? And this will usually be at the end of a very long journey, involving a number of very risky elements, desperately entrusting yourself in a small boat to one of the busiest shipping lanes in the world.

Most are fleeing persecution and conflict. And they have every right to seek asylum. It is lawful. So, we are presented with a moral issue that always has political implications, but which in this case is being played out of all proportion - and played with an element of prejudice. The numbers are really tiny, but the language of invasion is used, and talk of the Royal Air Force and the Royal Navy being involved. For heaven's sake! In fact, these asylum seekers to the UK are far fewer in number than are those approaching Germany, France, Spain and Greece. The language and actions in their regard are clearly designed to play upon people's fears, and perhaps distract attention from other issues.

Pope Francis, who has such a clear world-view and such a deeply Christ-centred heart, is constantly appealing for true generosity towards refugees and asylum seekers. It is not always easy, but it is important that we learn to see the world with those eyes and be prepared to speak out at the injustice of it."





UPDATE ON PEARSE

We're delighted to share with you an update on Pearse McDonagh and his formation for future ordination as a Permanent Deacon for the Archdiocese of Liverpool serving here in Holy Family Parish and in the Wigan Deanery.

Pearse has now begun his third year of the four-year programme of academic, spiritual and pastoral formation for ordination. Last year he was formally accepted and acknowledged by the Archbishop as a Candidate for Ordination. A further step along the journey to ordination is achieved this week when Pearse will receive the Ministry of Lector during a Mass celebrated on Tuesday evening (15th September) at Saint Teresa's Church in St. Helens. The next step after this will be for him to receive the Ministry of Acolyte before eventual ordination as a Deacon in the summer of 2022. Pearse has also recently begun a new role as Prison Chaplain at HMP Forest Bank, a category B male prison which accepts remand and sentenced adults and young offenders.

Please continue to hold Pearse, and his wife Nichola and their two boys, in your prayers as he continues his journey towards ordination and service as a Deacon.

UPDATE ON CHURCH REPAIRS

During the lockdown it was noticed that some areas of the church walls on the left hand side were "bubbling" causing the paint to flake off. On investigation this was found to be due to water seepage, which has now hopefully been remedied. After allowing time for the brickwork to dry, the affected areas will need to be replastered and repainted. We are waiting for a costing for this work.

The iron railings around the car park and the rear and right side of the church are showing signs of rust (one of the hinges on the main gates has already rusted through). They need to be treated and repainting. Weather permitting, this work was due to start this weekend at a cost of £3,800.

And the car park has been badly in need of resurfacing for a long time, the cost of which will be well in excess of £20K. Since we have now repaid the five-year loan for the interior repairs and renovation of the church, we hope the archdiocese will give us a new loan so that this work can take place.





YES, THIS MEANS YOU!



With Mary, our hearts are oriented toward the mystery of Jesus. Christ is put at the centre of our life, of our time, of our city, through the contemplation of his holy mysteries of joy, light, sorrow and glory.

May Mary help us to welcome within ourselves the grace emanating from these mysteries, so that through us Jesus can "water" society, beginning with our daily relationships, purifying them from so many negative forces, thus opening them to the newness of God. The Rosary, when it is prayed in an authentic way, not mechanical and superficial, brings great peace. For it contains within itself the healing power of the Most Holy Name of Jesus, invoked with faith and love at the centre of each "Hail Mary" we pray.





MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP MALCOLM FOR SYNOD SUNDAY 18TH OCTOBER 2020

I am writing this to you today because this was to have been the weekend of our Synod 2020 gathering. The situation we are living in at the moment has, as you know, meant that we felt it right to move the Synod until June next year. The work of the Synod has not stopped – God is still asking us to reflect on becoming the kind of Church he is calling us to be, and in many ways we have been invited to do this with a new urgency at this time.

Our Synod journey brings together the "imperatives" of co-responsibility, collaboration and genuine listening between Church leaders and the lay faithful. Synodality is an essential aspect of Church life today. Pope Francis is firm on this as the way forward. I am reminded of something that Pope Benedict said in 2012: "Lay people should not be regarded as collaborators of the clergy, but, rather, as people who are really co-responsible for the Church's being and acting ... It is therefore important that a mature and committed laity make its own specific contribution to the ecclesial mission with respect for the ministries and tasks that each one has in the life of the Church."

This is very much your role in the next part of our Synod journey. Over 3,500 proposals were submitted – thank you. The Synod Working Party (and others) have worked with all these proposals and have faithfully kept all the proposals and ideas that you have highlighted. They have produced a summary which we are making available to you this weekend at www.synod2020.co.uk

I need each of you to play your part in discerning the next steps forward. At the beginning of December each Synod Member will have to indicate which of the ideas and issues that they are most drawn to. They will need your input to do this faithfully. This will enable us to present to you, in March, the Synod Proposals to be voted on in June. After June we will work on drawing up a Pastoral Plan at Advent 2021 in the light of the Synod Proposals.

The next months are an exciting opportunity for us all to listen again to the voice of the Spirit of God guiding and directing us. Please play your part. We will not be able to complete this task faithfully without you.



"FRATELLI TUTTI"

Pope Francis visited Assisi on the 3rd of October, the eve of the feast day of Saint Francis of Assisi, to sign a new Encyclical Letter entitled "Fratelli Tutti" (which sounds more like a type of ice cream rather than a papal document!)



The title is a direct quotation from Saint Francis of Assisi which translates as Fraternity and Social Friendship. It's a reflection on something that Pope Francis cares deeply about: a concern for one another, for every other human being regardless of any difference.

We live in a time marked by war, poverty, migration, climate change and pandemic. Recognising a brother or sister in everyone we meet, and for Christians, recognising the face of Jesus in those who suffer – these responses reaffirm the irreducible dignity of every human person created in the image of God. They also remind us that no one can ever emerge from these present hardships alone, one against another, the global north against the global south, the rich against the poor or any other excluding differentiation.

One of the central themes of the encyclical reflects on our common belonging and responsibility. It is a reflection on our hopes for the future and encourages the church and people of good will to take responsibility for making those hopes a reality by working together.



Today in the Gospel, Jesus addresses his followers, all of us, telling us that we are "Blessed" (Mt 5:3). These are the Beatitudes. They do not require conspicuous gestures; they are not for supermen, but for those who live the trials and toils of every day, for us. This is how the saints are: like everyone, they breathe air polluted by the evil there is in the world, but on the journey they never lose sight of Jesus' roadmap, indicated in the Beatitudes, which is like the map of Christian life.


Today is the celebration of those who have reached the destination indicated by this map: not only the saints on the calendar, but many brothers and sisters whom we may have met and known. Today is a family celebration, of many simple, hidden people who in reality help God to move the world forward. And there are so many of them today! Thanks to these unknown brothers and sisters who help God to move the world forward, who live among us!

Lastly I would like to quote another beatitude, which is not found in the Gospel but at the end of the Bible, and it speaks of the end of life: "Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord" (Rev 14:13). Throughout this month we will be called to accompany with prayer our deceased, so they may be forever joyful in the Lord.

Let us remember our beloved departed ones with gratitude and let us pray for them. May the Mother of God, Queen of the Saints and Gate of Heaven, intercede for us on our journey of holiness and for our loved ones gone before us, who have departed for the heavenly Homeland.

FROM ARCHBISHOP MALCOLM

No one can fail to be moved by the heart-wrenching accounts of families that have been tragically affected by the coronavirus. Families are not only mourning their loved ones who have died but are often separated from their children, parents or grandparents because of the need to keep safe. One of the paradoxes of modern life is that as belief in the reason for Christmas declines the feast grows in importance because of its emphasis on family. Therefore, it seems appropriate that today we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family to ask for blessings on our own families.

Family life is strained by many different pressures, not only the coronavirus. This is felt none more so than by refugees, who experience acutely the dislocation of family life through war or persecution, but also by those who seek a different life through migration.

The Holy Family itself experienced the same pressure of dislocation, and today's gospel is a reminder that difficulties are never far away. Mary is warned by Simeon that a sword will pierce her own soul too. So it was that Joseph and Mary experienced the anxiety which is often shared by many parents about their children.

Our Catholic faith grows in our homes through the parents' love for each other and for their children. As we are drawn into this love, we can see the presence of Jesus as an additional member of our family, guiding, supporting and loving each of us. For this reason, we can be sure that Jesus dwells in all our families, giving families the strength to take up their crosses and so follow him, to rise again after they have fallen, to forgive one another, to bear one another's burdens.

The presence of Jesus in our families is seen in the many signs of hope which are around us. While I am well aware that family life is not simple, I also know that the love that is deep within a family is possible, because that love is an expression of God's love for us.

May the new year ahead be a time of peace and health. And may the Lord bless you and your families.
