

EPIPHANY HOUSE BLESSING

Please take a House Blessing Sticker from the back of church (take one for a friend too if you wish) to attach to your front door and to use to bless your home at the beginning of this New Year. The Blessing of Homes on the Feast of the Epiphany enjoys a long history. The inscription below is written or fixed on the house front door:

20 * C + M + B + 22

The numerals at the beginning and end stand for the New Year 2022, the Star led the wisemen to the Christ Child, and the three Crosses are a sign of a blessing made in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The capital letters are the initials of the Latin phrase: *Christus Mansionem Benedicat* (May Christ bless this house).

As you fix the sticker with the inscription to your door you may wish to say the following Prayer of Blessing:

Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who live here with health, goodness, gentleness, and faith. Fill us with the light of Christ so our love may include every brother and sister. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

In the Eastern Churches the solemnity of the Epiphany was the original feast of Christ's birth. When adopted by the West, it became a celebration of the revelation of God's eternal plan of salvation in Christ, manifested as "the light to enlighten all nations" and represented traditionally in the story of the Magi. From early times it was associated also with a commemoration of the Lord's baptism when he was anointed as Messiah and revealed as God's Son.

The custom of keeping Christmas decorations until Epiphany has been celebrated helps to show that Christmas and Epiphany are but two aspects of the same feast. It would be even more appropriate to extend this custom through the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord, the close of the season of Christmas.
